LEGAL & ETHICAL WOOD COLLECTION	BEST TOOLS TO TAKE WITH YOU
<p>Never collect from private land without permission.</p> <p>Avoid nature reserves, protected woodland, and SSSIs.</p> <p>Only take deadwood that's already fallen — don't cut live trees.</p> <p>Respect local bylaws — some areas ban wood collection entirely.</p>	<p>Bow saw or pruning saw</p> <p>Gloves and protective clothing</p> <p>Rope or tie-down straps</p> <p>Tarp for covering wood</p> <p>Moisture meter (optional, to check seasoning)</p>

SAFETY & TRANSPORT TIPS

- Lift logs using your legs — not your back.
- Don't overload your vehicle — stack securely and low.
- Secure your load with bungees or ratchet straps.
- Watch for rot, pests, or mold in wood. Bring a headtorch if collecting late.
