Sandy Lane EcoPlot: Proposal for Sustainable Land Stewardship in Irby

Dear Planning Officer or Councilor,

I am writing to express my interest in managing a piece of greenbelt land on Sandy Lane North, Irby, which holds historical residential use status (noted in 1987) and is currently unused. As a local resident working with members of the community on this very road, I would like to propose a long-term plan for using this land as a model for low-impact, sustainable living.

Project Overview

- To live sustainably and off-grid on the land
- To grow food organically using no-dig/permaculture methods
- To increase biodiversity through native planting and wildlife support
- To share sustainable practices through online outreach and education




Local Ties & Community Support

Planned Land Use and Infrastructure

- Non-permanent shepherd's hut or cabin as a land management base
- No-dig vegetable beds and composting systems
- Pollinator meadows and a wildlife pond
- Habitat shelters for hedgehogs, frogs, birds, and insects
- Rainwater harvesting, compost toilets, solar and wind systems

Occasional use of chickens and ducks (for eggs and pest control)
